## YWCA Metropolitan Chicago Celebrates Landmark 50th Annual Leader Luncheon

Milestone Event Represents a Retrospective Celebration of a Proud Legacy of Social Impact and Activism

In 1972, YWCA Metropolitan Chicago held its first Leader Luncheon, instating a commitment to the recognition of women's leadership. Fifty years later, the tradition continues and typical attendance at the annual event has grown to more than 1,200. While honoring the broad social justice, gender and racial equity work of individuals—and organizations—may not seem novel today, 50 years ago it was a trailblazing concept.

Reflecting on 50 years of progress and setbacks since 1972 reminds us of why we are called to recognize the seen and unseen work of so many leaders who have advanced our mission and have proceeded, unafraid to speak out. On our path towards justice, we stand in solidarity, to dismantle discrimination and oppression while uplifting equity, justice and liberation.

Outstanding Leader in Racial Justice: Natalie Moore, Author and Journalist, WBEZ Corporate Social Innovation: Discover


**Outstanding Leader in Health Equity:** Allison Arwady, M.D., Commissioner, Chicago Department of Public Health


